Pink roses and white and pink lilies – pink is your favourite colour. The flowers encircle the womb on both sides, cocooning your little one.

The baby blanket draped across your tummy represents the comfort and protection that a mother gives her child throughout her life.

The stork is representative of the exciting birth date which will soon be here.

Finally, the butterflies, which have many symbolic meanings, including:

- Tranformation: Your life will be transformed by the little one growing inside you.
- In Greek myth, Psyche (which literally translates to mean "soul") is represented in the form of a butterfly. Befittingly, Psyche is forever linked with love as she and Eros (the Greek god of love, also known in Roman myth as Cupid) shared an endlessly passionate bond together both hopelessly in love with the other.
- The butterfly also symbolizes the life cycle. when the caterpillar spins his web he "seems to die...but he lives again as a butterfly" so this can also be seen as a comparison to life after death, with the symbol representing loved ones who are still with us in our hearts but cannot be there in person.
